MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT By Dean Doucet

Dear Cousins.

The Mission Statement states, in part, that our "mission is to bring together individuals and families ... to perpetuate an appreciation for our family heritage....so that each generation may have a greater appreciation for those who have walked before us."

I truly believe that has been our controlling drive as an organization. With that have come joys and frustrations. There has been great joy in participating with other family members in activities, such as the CMA reunions. There has been great joy in seeing family members find their place in the family tree, establishing a link with the past generations. There has been great joy in establishing relationships with cousins near and far. Some live where there are a number of Acadian/Cajun people about to keep the culture alive. That has brought a great joy, feeling the atmosphere of where our ancestors lived and died. We have tried to reach out to the extended family by having a page on Facebook, using modern technology to make our presence known. We have built a web site to collect articles about our heritage and publish genealogical data about our family members.

Maybe we need to do more, or do things in a different way. We need your ideas and suggestions.

My mind keeps returning to the past. Families were very important in society. The Bible story is about families, the family of Adam and Eve, the family of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. CINEMA ON THE BAYOU By Carol Doucet

We enjoyed seeing two films during the Bayou Film Festival, Cinema on the Bayou 2012, in Lafayette, Louisiana.

On Saturday, January 28, 2012, we viewed "THE FADING CAJUN CULTURE." This Centerville High School Production, which was filmed by students, chronicles the origins of French settlers from Poitou, France to Nova Scotia, Canada and, eventually, to Louisiana. Once in Louisiana, the film cultural focuses on changes such Americanization of the Acadians into the current French dialect, trapping and Cajun culture. commercial fishing are highlighted as each of these seems to be 'fading' from prominence. industry, farming and musical influences are explored along with regional festivals." Director/Producer— Ray Breaux (teacher who received the grant for this film); Camera Crew—Bridget Ishcomer, Jonathan Guy, Jordan Brightwell; Freelance Photographer— Jess Bailey; Poster Artist—Heather Verret.

On Sunday, January 29, we saw the U.S. premiere of "DÉLIVRANCE," by Danny Thibeau and Donovan Richard, writer/director. This dramatic narrative feature film tells the story of the escape in 1756 from Fort Beauséjour by Pierre-Henri Surette and his followers, and Surette's return to battle for the rest of the men who were left behind before their deportation by the British. The film was shot primarily at Fort Beauséjour (in the fort's ruins), in the areas of Memramcook and along the Petitcodiac

River. This film premiered across Canada this past fall with great fanfare. The amazing cast and crew created "a great snapshot of the hell Acadians were subject to during the great expulsion," says film and music writer Jim Lavoie. "Well written, directed, shot and acted. This is one film that "Delivered" as promised." The film is in both French and English, with English subtitles."

Following each film was a question and answer session.

What made those two days special, besides the fact that both films were well thought out and presented very well, and that we met the producers and those responsible for the films, was that the two films presented Cajuns as they are, not as stereotypes as too often seen in movies, documentaries and tv shows produced by outsiders.

GRAND RÉVEIL ACADIEN (GREAT ACADIAN AWAKENING) By Carol Doucet

Ray Trahan, President of Louisiane-Acadie, Inc., organizers of the Grand Réveil Acadien, wrote, "Our goal is to educate, inspire and mobilize the thousands of Acadians and their friends, especially our youth, to participate in the continued expression of our native French language, culture and heritage and develop ways to secure its future while increasing our quality of life."

From October 7 to 16, 2011, the entire region of South Louisiana opened its doors to welcome family and friends who wanted to celebrate and to help maintain the culture, customs and traditions of the Acadians and to remember their history. This celebration occurred in four Acadian regions. New Orleans, Houma, Lake Charles and Lafayette hosted events and celebrations closing with a huge renewal of pride on the last day at Festivals Acadiens at Girard Park in Lafayette.

On Friday, October 7, Opening Ceremonies for Grand Réveil Acadien (Great Acadian Awakening)2011 were held in New Orleans. Saturday was devoted to discovering and visiting the New Orleans area.

Dedication of Great Acadian Upheaval Commemoration Monument, Houma, LA

Events in Houma began on Sunday, October 9, with the unveiling and blessing of the Great Acadian Upheaval Commemoration Monument downtown near the Bayou Terrebonne Waterlife Museum. Keynote speaker was Stephen White, genealogist of the University of Moncton, New Brunswick. He was followed by Tim Hebert, author and creator of the Acadian-Cajun genealogy and history website.

The following Monday was filled with activities such as marsh grass planting, wetland tours and a Louisiana Universities Museum Consortium.

The highlight of the two days of the Grand Réveil Acadien in Lake Charles, Tuesday, October 11 and Wednesday, October 12, was a genealogy seminar/workshop with keynote speaker Stephen White. The second day followed the pattern, discovering the area.

The last four days of the Grand Réveil Acadien were in Lafayette, the hub city of Acadiana.

On Wednesday, October 12, a rosary was prayed in French at the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist.

Thursday was the Acadian Family Day at the Cajun Dome Convention Center.

On Friday, the Musée de Maurice hosted a beignet and coffee get together. The opening of Festivals Acadiens followed in the evening in Lafayette at Girard Park.

Saturday and Sunday were filled with the activities of Festivals Acadiens. Sunday morning



there was an outdoor Catholic Mass in French. The group "Angelus" provided the music. The singing of the hymns in French was impressive. In the early afternoon there was a Grand Procession with participants representing several Acadian traditions: "Courir du Mardi Gras," the "Tintamarre," the "Mi-Carême," the Guiianné," and the "Chandeleur."



The youth groups from Louisiana and Canada joined in. The procession came to a boisterous climax in front of the main stage.



Three outstanding groups—Hert LeBlanc, Bruce Daigrepont, and Michael Doucet and Beausoleil were great choices to bring the Grand Réveil Acadien and Fesitvals Acadiens to a very enjoyable and fitting close.

<u>Date Squares</u> Submitted by Jeannine Caissie

Ingredients:

- 2 cups water
- 2 packets of dates (8 oz.)
- 1 cup lard
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 2 cups oat flour
- 2 cups wheat flour
- 1 teaspoon soda
- 1 teaspoon salt



Preparation:

Put the two packets of dates in a pot with two cups of hot water. Boil over medium flame until the dates break apart. Grease a pan with lard. Mix flour, lard, brown sugar, oat flour, white flour, soda and salt. Separate into two portions and spread out first layer in greased pan. Spread out all of the dates and spread rest of mixture on top of dates. Bake in 375° oven for 35 minutes. Allow to cool before cutting into squares.

Carrés aux dattes

Ingrédients:

- 2 T d'eau
- 2 paquets de dattes (8 onces)
- 1 T de saindoux
- 1 T de sucre brun
- 2 T de farine d'avoine
- 2 T de farine blanche
- 1 cuil. à thé de soda
- 1 cuil. à thé de sel



Préparation:

Mettre les deux paquets de dattes dans un chaudron avec 2 T d'eau chaude. Faire bouillir à feu moyen jusqu'à ce que les dates soient défaites. Graisser un plat avec du saindoux. Étaler une couche du mélange de farine (d'avoine, farine blanche, soda et sel). Étendre toutes les dattes. Étendre le reste du mélange de farine sur les dattes. Mettre au four (375°) pendant 35 minutes. Laisser refroidir avant de couper en carrés.
